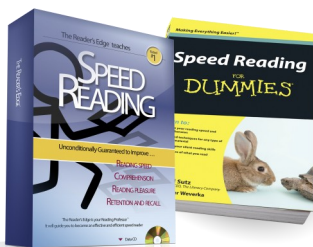

Every standardized test is a speed-reading test!

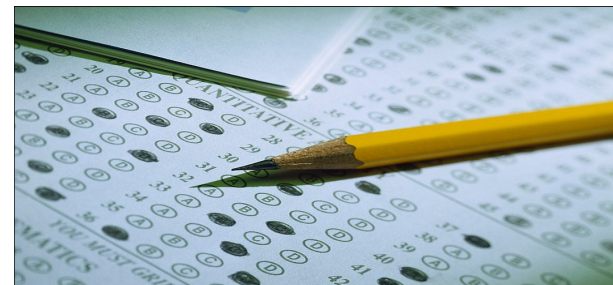
